



Minutes of the PROTECT meeting # 32

Location: EMSA, Lisbon

Hosted by: EMSA

Date: 17 November 2016.

1. Opening by Chairman

Jerome opens the meeting at 10:00, thanking Lazaros for his hospitality and arrangements. He informs the participants that, much to his regret, the representation from the Rotterdam Port Authority, Raymond Seignette and Cor Koert, were unable to travel to Lisbon for this occasion. He will have to find an alternative for their part in the presentations. Furthermore, the proposal from Cor concerning the waste and security information to be obtained from the captain of the ships, cannot be discussed and will have to wait until the next meeting.

Lazaros also welcomes the participants on behalf of EMSA and believes it is a good opportunity to meet with PROTECT and learn from each other. He mentions the good relationship with PROTECT which he feels is very active and fruitful. Certainly, for one of EMSA's tasks, the hazmat issue, feedback from PROTECT is very important. He reminds the participants that EMSA is a technical agency, supporting the EU member states. It is not part of the EC. He wishes all participants and useful and fruitful meeting!

A rollcall takes place. Simon announces his resignation as Chairman of SMDG and that he will no longer be able to participate in PROTECT, on behalf of SMDG. He will ask the new chairman of SMDG, Buis van Driel, to take over this task.

2. Minutes of previous meeting # 31 (Bremen)

The minutes were presented and adopted without any remarks. Tanguy mentions that his presentation about cybersecurity will be done during next meeting.

3. EMS Projects / Prototype

Lazaros presents the general objectives of the eManifest Pilot Project.

4. EMSA Project e-Manifest

Charles give an extensive presentation about the e-Manifest Pilot Project.

There after Philippe presents the EMSW 'State of Play' (European Maritime Single Window).



A discussion takes place about several issues, like 'why ISO standard?' and what will be the future of the PCS? Will a PCS be able to connect to EMSW?

Lazaros answers that it will be impossible to support all different PCS systems in Europe. He shows a graph with NSW connecting to PCS and the EMSW will then connect to the NSW (National Single Window).

Jaume: It is a problem that you cannot be certain if a message has arrived at EMSW or not. There is no feedback.

Stephan: A PCS has more tasks, i.e. to provide data to other (non-governmental) parties.

5. NSW Status implementation

Charles presents RFD (Reporting Formalities Directive).

Subsequently a brief report is given by the countries about the status of the implementation:

Portugal: Filippe

Germany: Stephan

France: Frederic and Florence

Spain: Jaume

Belgium: Nico

6. Peer review of the directive 2010/65

Unfortunately, Raymond is not present to give their feedback from the recent EMSA peer review in The Netherlands. In his place Jerome gives a brief overview of Raymond's report about this review by EMSA.

7. Current status of standardization work of WCO, UN/Cefact and ISO

Philippe presents Data Mapping and Messages. See his presentation.

He mentions that a WCO-expert from NL has assisted him: Mr. Siebrand Bootsma.

8. Discussion on Data Formats: ISO 28005, XML, Edifact, WCO Model

Michael Dill presents the Gefeg tool for the mapping of the WCO data model, using data from the Taxud/Gefeg website. He explains that the European Customs Model (ECM) is a subset of the WCO data model. Keywords are 're-use of data' in aggregate or detailed form depending on the use of data.


9. Next PROTECT meeting
